# 202 Homeschool Freedom END-OF-SESSION REPORT

The Colorado Homeschool Freedom Team (HSFT) is a ministry of CHEC which envisions families honoring Jesus Christ by embracing home discipleship that is Christ centered, parent directed, and free from government control.

With the defeat of Proposition HH by the voters on the 2023 ballot, the governor called for a special session just before the Thanksgiving holiday in 2023 where the legislature pushed ahead and implemented parts of Prop HH despite its significant loss at the ballot box. Property taxes, land use, affordable housing, and TABOR (Taxpayer Bill of Rights) continued to be significant topics during the 2024 legislative session. Don't be fooled by talk of lower property taxes and housing costs. The bills passed this year will not bring the much-needed relief from the overburdening regulatory state the legislators have created over the past decade, but they will redistribute taxpayer funds in an attempt to strangle the middle-class. Check out the analyses done by the Common Sense Institute (Common Sense Institute (i2i.org).

Anyone familiar with the **United Nations' Sustainability Goals** would recognize that most of the bills passed in the areas of education, housing, climate & environment, energy, transportation, centralized zoning, illegal immigrants, and gun control align with their globalist agenda. In the education realm, we saw bills that dealt with elevating children's desires over parents' decisions (HB24-1039), tracking education and career outcomes (HB24-1364), expanding school-based health centers (SB24-034), and an attempt to bring the government closer to controlling homeschooling through funding (SB24-122). A bill (SB24-216) to allow public libraries to continue to push agenda-ridden materials and stop the community from trying to protect little children from pornography was introduced and passed at the very end of session.

**God is good!** We were able to raise the alarm on a proposed ballot resolution (HCR24-1003) which would have placed the right of a child to a "quality education of their choice" in the Colorado Constitution. The resolution was stopped by the sponsor in committee. Praise God! But, be on the lookout for a similar initiative being proposed for the 2024 ballot. While it is true that children are endowed with the same God-given inalienable rights as adults, parents are the ones who must steward those rights until their children are capable of taking on the responsibility that comes with exercising those rights. Parents have the fundamental right to direct the education, care, and upbringing of their children. Giving children rights above their parents makes the state responsible for ensuring and providing for those rights — which means the state would control what a quality education is and how it should be provided.

#### **HOME EDUCATION**

Efforts to use government dollars to fund private education including homeschooling continue across the states and Colorado is no exception (see SB24-122). CHEC continues to oppose government funding for homeschoolers because of the necessary accountability measures attached to such funding. Freedom is never free. It always takes sacrifice.

## HB24-1448 New Public School Finance Formula (McCluskie, Bacon, Lundeen, Zenzinger)

Creates a new public school formula. *During this rewrite of the law, they changed some of the wording in the homeschool law.* 

## SB24-122 Empowerment Scholarship Accounts (Kirkmeyer)

This bill would have created a program to funnel state education funding to private education for children for special needs which was broadly defined. *All government funding necessarily comes with accountability regulations. Because it included the homeschool law, CHEC opposed this bill.* Bill failed to pass the Senate Education Committee.

## HCR24-1003 School Choice in K-12 Education System (Weinberg)

This bill would have put before the voters an amendment to the CO Constitution to enshrine the right of children to a quality education. *This feeds into the statists' ideal of taking control over all forms of education including homeschooling!* Bill failed to pass the House State, Civic, Military, & Veterans Affairs Committee.

#### **DATA**

### HB24-1288 Earned Income Tax Credit Data Sharing (Rutinel)

Creates a pilot program to share the contact information of taxpayers claiming the earned income tax credits (EITC and child tax credits (CTC) with the Behavioral Health Administration, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Early Childhood, the Department of Health Care Policy & Financing, the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Human Services, the

Department of Labor and Employment, the Department of Local Affairs, and the Department of Public Health & Environment.

#### HB24-1364 Education-Based Workforce Readiness (McCluskie, Bacon, Bridges, Lundeen)

Authorizes the Colorado Department of Education to commission a financial study to analyze the costs to the state and potential cost savings to provide students the opportunity to obtain college credits, industry credentials, and work-based learning experiences. Also creates a statewide longitudinal database to track children through adulthood from their public school and university education experiences to their careers. *Currently does not include homeschoolers who do not use public school programs, or state colleges or universities.* 

### SB24-041 Privacy Protections for Children's Online Data (Rodriguez, Lundeen)

Adds enhanced protections when a minor's (under 13 years of age) data is processed and there is a heightened risk of harm to the minor. *Does not include email or direct messaging*. **Unanimously passed the House and Senate**.

#### **EDUCATION**

These bills are a sampling of the laws being passed in the education sphere. Pay attention to the system they are building in the public schools because the goal is to extend their control into every form of education. Our children must be prepared to live in the world built by the educators of the majority of children in our state and our nation.

### HB24-1039 Non-Legal Name Change (Vigil, Faith Winter, Marchman)

Requires public schools to use a student's preferred name and deems a school's refusal to use a student's preferred name a form of prosecutable discrimination. Forces public schools to socially transition a child's gender based solely on the child's desire and allows the public schools to keep secrets from parents.

## HB24-1285 Student Weight-Based Bullying Prevention (Marchman, Gardner)

Adds bullying on the basis of a student's weight, height, or body size to the public school bullying statutes.

### SB24-014 Seal of Climate Literacy Diploma Endorsement (Hansen, McLachlan)

Authorizes a public high school to issue a "seal of climate literacy diploma endorsement" for completing coursework that aligns with the climate agenda. The legislature has already passed two special diploma seals in Colorado. What impact will these seals have on homeschooling graduates? Only time will tell.

### SB24-034 Increase Access to School-Based Health Care (Marchman, Kolker, Garcia)

Expands the number of school-based health centers. These centers provide a wide range of services from primary, behavioral, and preventative health care. Most of the services require no interaction with parents. The ultimate goal is to make the schoolhouse the new center of community for children without parents.

## SB24-071 Seasonal Outdoor Adventure Day Camp Programs (Fenberg, Rich, Amabile, Soper)

Creates a new category under a child care license for seasonal outdoor adventure day camps for children five years or younger.

## SB24-078 Outdoor Nature-Based Preschool Programs (Marchman, Priola, Joseph, McLachlan)

Creates a new category under a child care license for outdoor naturebased preschools for children between the ages of three and eight.

## SB24-084 Attorney General Duties to Prevent Mis- & Dis-Information (Cutter, Garcia)

Requires the Colorado Attorney General to develop resources that can be used by schools, organizations, and community leaders to identify and combat misinformation and disinformation according to the state's worldview. We saw this requirement in public school through media literacy standards.

## SB24-142 Oral Health Screening in Schools Pilot Program (Van Winkle, Michaelson Jenet)

Creates a pilot program to screen and track children's oral hygiene in kindergarten and 3rd grade. The screener has the authority to make referrals for services. As written, parents can "refuse" to participate in the program. How will refusal be seen by the state?

## SB24-162 Best Practices to Prevent Discrimination in Schools (Marchman, Winter, Bacon, Herod)

Creates a committee in the Department of Education that develops training which is trauma-informed (look this term up) and includes "best practices" for dealing with bullying, harassment, and discrimination in the public schools. Remember they defined harassment last year as any "unwelcome" verbal conduct.

#### SB24-216 Standards for Decisions Regarding Library Resources (Cutter, Michaelson Jenet, Joseph)

Defines what standards a public library must consider if a community member asks for any materials to be removed from the library. *Essentially, libraries can use these standards to keep pornographic books on their shelves.* (Original bill, SB24-049, would have applied to public school libraries as well but was pulled by the sponsor.)

#### LIFE

#### SB24-068 Medical Aid-in-Dying (Ginal, Brown)

Loosens some of the regulations regarding euthanasia in Colorado making it easier to obtain lethal doses of the medications used to end a person's life.

## SJR24-003 Roe v. Wade Anniversary Day (Gonzales, Winter F., Froelich, Garcia)

Designates January 22nd as "Roe v. Wade Anniversary Day" in Colorado and recommends that Colorado voters amend the CO Constitution to enshrine the right to abortion.

## SJR24-008 Title X Funding (Marchman, Buckner, Lukens, Willford)

Declares Colorado's commitment to adequately funding reproductive care to Coloradans across the state. *Remember, last year they redefined reproductive care to include gender-affirming care.* 

#### **PARENTS/FAMILIES**

## HB24-1017 Bill of Rights for Foster Youth (Daughtery, Parenti, Zenzinger, Michaelson Jenet)

Establishes a statutory bill of rights for children (5 years old and up) in the foster care system including freedom from religion, freedom from being isolated (time outs?), freedom from limitations of use or searches of personal belongings (phone? computers?), freedom to access reproductive care (abortion and genderaffirming care), to name a few. *Next step is to give all children these rights above their parents' rights.* 

## **HB24-1021 Motor Vehicle Minor Driver Education Standards (Lindsay)**

Changes the requirements for minors to obtain a driver's learning permit and license.

## HB24-1055 Child Passenger Safety & Education (Froelich, Pugliese, F. Winter, Priola)

Changes the child restraint system requirements while driving in a car up to 13 years of age.

#### HB24-1136 Healthier Social Media Use by Youth (Publiese, Amabile, Cutter, Smallwood)

Requires social media providers to put out warnings to youth after using an application for a certain amount of time. Creates resources for public schools to use to educate youth on the dangers of prolonged social media usage.

#### **HB24-1350 Parental Responsibilities Proceedings Child Safety (Froelich, Story,** Winter)

Concerning standards related to court proceedings for allocation of parental responsibilities to keep children safe. Makes sure. in family custody cases, domestic violence and coercion are considered by the judge. It also places more emphasis on a child's opinion in these very difficult situations.

#### **HB24-1471 Electroconvulsive Treatment for** Minors (Young, Bradfield, Michaelson Jenet)

Expands access to electroconvulsive treatment for children under 16 years old with parental consent.

#### SB24-001 Continue Youth Mental Health Services Program (Michaelson Jenet, Brown)

Continues the iMatter program until 2034. This program allows children to get six free mental health sessions with a stateapproved therapist without parental consent or knowledge.

#### SB24-200 Equity, Diversity, & Inclusion in Child Welfare (Michaelson Jenet, Coleman, Bacon, Joseph)

Promotes DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion) in the Child Welfare System by updating the collection of demographic and other data and using it to evaluate the system as a whole.

#### **RELIGIOUS LIBERTY**

#### SB24-189 Gender-Related Bias-Motivated **Crimes (Fields, Hansen, Weissman)**

Added "transgender identity" to what is considered a biasmotivated crime or hate crime which adds additional charges to the accused. This has the potential to be used to persecute Christians with a biblical worldview in the future.

#### SCR24-003 Protecting the Freedom to Marry (Ginal)

Puts before the Colorado voters a ballot measure to remove from the CO Constitution the statement that "only a union of one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as marriage in this state."
